1. Purpose of Paper

The aim of this report is to update the Strategic Partnership on the 2011 Census, specifically;

- The first release of multi variable tables from the 2011 Census
- The availability of the first set of 2011 Census Briefings

2. Introduction and background

A census is a count of people and households, and is used to set policies and estimate the resources required to provide services for the population.

The information the census provides allows central and local government, health authorities and many other organisations to target their resources more effectively and to plan housing, education, health and transport services for years to come.

Themes will include Economy & Employment, Housing, Health & Wellbeing, Education & Learning, Population, Transport, Deprivation, Equalities and Migration. There will also be an overall City Profile.

3. 2011 Census Briefings and BHSP census event

The first five 2011 Census Briefings are now available on BHLIS at www.bhlis.org/census2011 and are themed around;

- The City Profile
- Equalities
- Housing
- Transport
- Economy & Employment

The BHSP census event took place at the end of May 2013. The event was themed around the census briefings with presentations on each topic. The presentations contained additional information to the briefings, including a more detailed look at the city's population profile. The presentations can be circulated to members on request.

4 2011 Census data released since March's BHSP

May 2013 saw the release of the first multi variable tables from the 2011 census. Multi variable tables are essentially the single variable Key and Quick statistical tables crossed by each other with an emphasis on age and gender. This first release centred around equality data particularly ethnicity. Examples of the types of tables available include;

- Disability by ethnic group by gender and age
- Economic activity by ethnic group by gender and age

- Hours worked by gender and disability

This first release is currently available at the national, regional and local authority level; however, before the end of July it will be made available at ward level.

Multi variable data is only currently available via the ONS on NOMIS at www.nomisweb.co.uk

5. Further 2011 Census data releases

The ONS have recently been moving away from their published release schedule so the timing of future releases is a little unclear. The latest notification simply mentioned that Local Characteristics (further multi variable tables) are planned for release starting in August 2013.
